

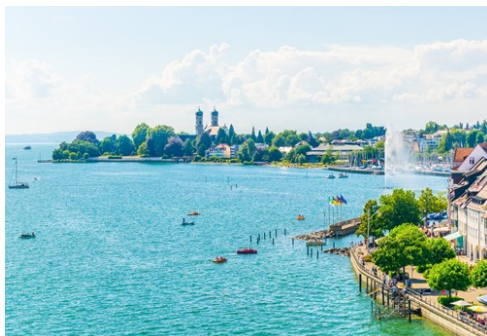

Nestled alongside the Northern shore of Lake Constance, and set against the backdrop of the magnificent Alps, this thriving city is the perfect place to relax and to enjoy nature. However, it has much more to show off: painstakingly rebuilt after its near complete destruction in the Second World War, Friedrichshafen has made history as the birthplace of the Zeppelin aircraft. Visit the city's renowned Zeppelin museum or embark on an exciting voyage on board of a real Zeppelin ship to experience Friedrichshafen's history.

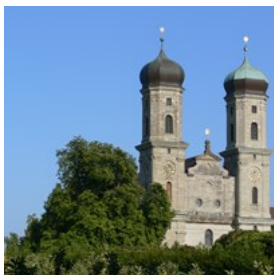
Zeppelin Well

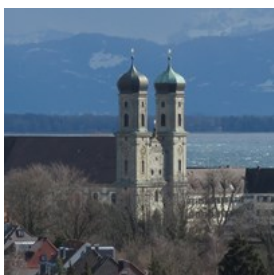
Castle Church of Friedrichshafen

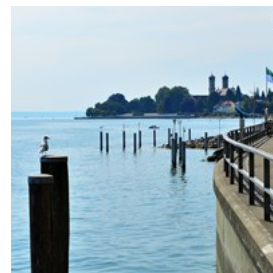
Lake Constance Trail

Mole Tower



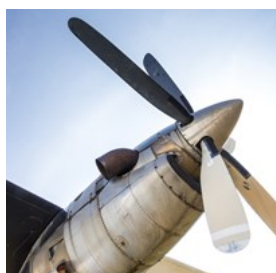
Mole Tower is a unique lookout point from where you can enjoy the beautiful Lake Constance, the Alps and Friedrichshafen right

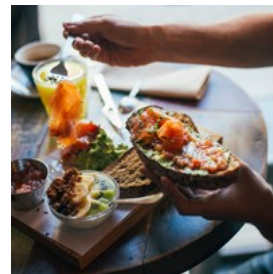

Passport / Visa



Germany can be visited visa-free for up to 90 days by citizens of most European countries, Australia, New Zealand, Japan, South Korea,

Taiwan, Malaysia, Israel, UAE and most countries in America. If you are unsure whether or not you need to apply for a visa, we recommend contacting the embassy or consulate in your country. International (non-Schengen) travelers need a passport that is valid for at least 3 months after the end of their intended trip in order to enter the Schengen zone. Citizens of Schengen countries can travel without a passport, but must have a valid ID with them during their stay.
