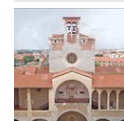

“Catalan Perpignan” used to be the capital of French Catalonia from the 10th to the 17th century and reached its Golden Age as the capital of the Kingdom of Majorca. The main elements of its heritage were created in this pinnacle period, and many of the city's architectural landmarks date back to those times.

Due to its geographic position, the city is undoubtedly one of the centres of the Catalan, Roman and Mediterranean cultures - something that is clearly traceable through its language and traditions. Perpignan has always gathered people from different origins, creating an eclectic blend of ethnicities within the city limits. The Palace of Kings de Majorque will give you a glimpse of a Kingdom that once existed in Majorca. The Old Town is well-preserved with its original historic character still intact. There, you will certainly enjoy nice and relaxing walks discovering the city's roots.

Perpignan is also a modern and vibrant city, a great destination warmly welcoming international visitors. The city is always changing and the gourmets will also enjoy its excellent southern gastronomy.

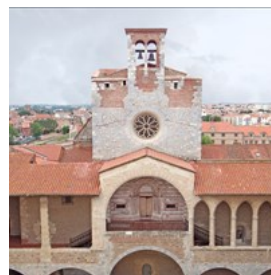

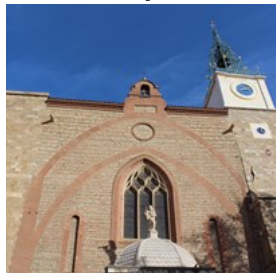

Loge De Mer (Town Hall)

Made of river stones, it represents the typical architecture of the region. It used to be a stock exchange and the maritime consulate, as symbolized by the hard-to-miss iron vessel.

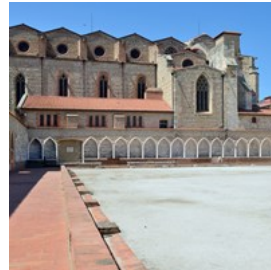

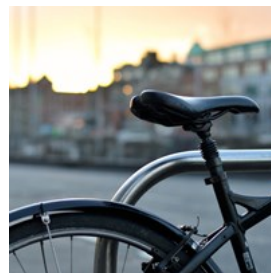

A fun way to discover the city is by bike. If you opt to take a guided tour, a guide will show you the most interesting attractions in Perpignan.

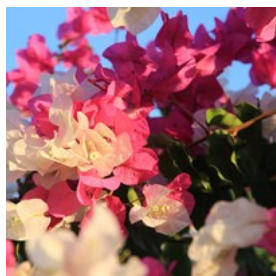
Along the tour, which lasts approximately 2 hours, you will see the modern part of the city as well as the historical centre, all while having fun and working out.

Couvent Des Minimes



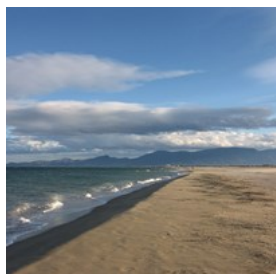

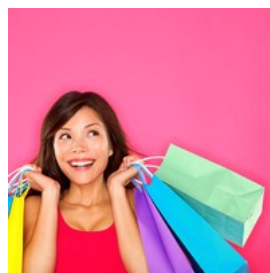
The best way to enjoy shopping in this city is definitely just wandering around the city centre, without a particular destination, since one of

Rivesaltes Airport



Perpignan is served by an international airport, Rivesaltes, located just 7 km north of the city. The cheapest and fastest way to get into the town is the shuttle service with Courriers Catalans (tel: +33 468 55 68 00) that takes approximately 15 minutes. The buses are more or less synchronized with the flights time schedule and you can purchase your bus ticket directly from the bus driver.

There is also a taxi rank just outside the terminal, a faster, but more expensive way to get into the city (the trip, in this case, takes about 10 minutes).

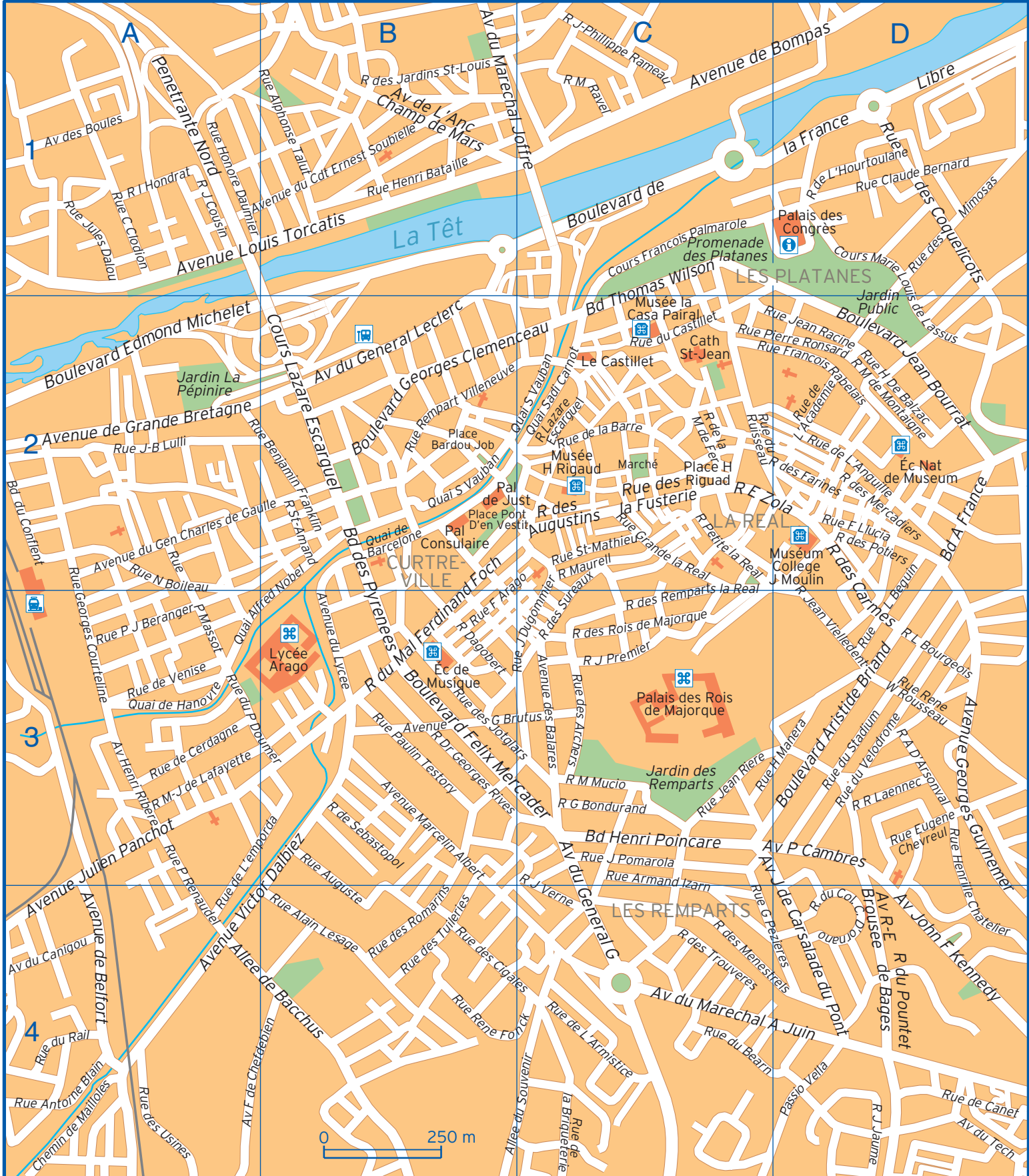
