



Providenciales is the primary tourist destination of the Turks and Caicos archipelago, which sits just north of Hispaniola. Its popularity is hardly surprising: this Caribbean island offers long stretches of white sandy beaches and turguoise waters, perfect for extended snorkelling sessions. That's why so many upscale resorts and restaurants have come to line its shores, and a plethora of boutiques and galleries greet tourists that stroll around the main plazas: everything is in place for a welcoming and fun-filled stay.





THE ISLAND

At 98 kilometres in size (~38 square miles), the island of Providenciales, referred to as "Provo" by locals, is the most visited and developed of the Turks and Caicos islands.

On its northern side you'll find Grace Bay and its long stretches of white beaches together with its coral reefs, which can be explored during snorkelling and scuba diving sessions. This is also the place that hosts many high-class seafront resorts, as well as the majority of the island's restaurants, which uphold Caribbean culinary tradition and flavors.

On the other end of the island, together with the beaches of Sapodilla Bay and Copper Jack, there's Chalk Sound, a natural lagoon that houses a national park famous for its clear-blue lake dotted with rocky islands. If you want more privacy during your stay, there are also private villas up for rent here.

If you head westward, you'll reach the Providenciales International Airport, which is the main point of entry for the archipelago, while on the east side there's the Blue Hills area, which features the highest elevation point on the island, Blue Mountain.

This world-renowned destination comes from

humble beginnings: it was relatively unknown until the 1970s, when the local government recognised the island's tourism potential and established the first hotels, roads and port. It wasn't until the Club Med resort and the South Dock opened during the 1980s that the island's growth in both population and visitors started to rise dramatically, marking the start of the island's steady progress towards becoming one of the main attractions in the Caribbean.

If there are two things Providenciales is famous for, those must be its beaches and crystalline waters. Grace Bay Beach is certainly the most visited, but don't forget about the stretches of white sand located at Sapodilla Bay and Turtle Tail. The many snorkelling and scuba diving companies will let you explore local coral reefs and marine life, in case you choose to go beyond simply enjoying the shoreline vistas.

Grace Bay Beach



Regarded by some as one of the best beaches in the world, Grace Bay Beach is three miles long and features pristine-white sand together with

seaweed- and pollution-free waters. If you're looking for more activities other than shoreline



walks and admiring the nearby coral reefs, you can book a parasailing flight to enjoy a different viewing angle.

Leeward Beach



Even though it stretches to the east from Grace Bay Beach, Leeward Beach is less crowded than its neighbouring counterpart, allowing you

to find the perfect spot for relaxing on its shoreline. Walking here grants you the opportunity to enjoy the view of the many local resorts, but also to visit the Turks and Caicos Rock Iguana sanctuary. Other activities include water sports like wakeboarding and kayaking.

Being an island, Providenciales' cuisine has always centred around fish, clams and other seafood, but thanks to the surge in tourists and visitors, you can now find food inspired by different traditions and cultures from all around the world. The go-to place for both high-class dining and budget eateries has to be Grace Bay, where many restaurants are concentrated, but there's one thing you won't find on the island: international fast food joints, something that is held up as a badge of honour by the Turks and

Caicos.

Passport / Visa



You must have a valid passport with you to enter Turks and Caicos. Upon arrival, you will need to fill out an immigration form.

Moreover, the head of each family will also be required to complete a customs form (C105). If you are travelling with people that are not family-related, each one of them will have to fill out the form.



Some countries are exempt from needing a visa in order to enter the Turks and Caicos islands. The updated list can be found at the following website:

www.gov.tc/bordercontrol/products-and-services/ visa

If the name of your country does not appear on that list, you will need a visa. However, if you have either a US Tourist or Resident Visa (including a H-1B work visa or green card), a UK Tourist or Resident Visa, or a Canadian Tourist or Resident Visa, you will not need a visa. Best Time To Visit



Even though weather in Providenciales is mild year-round, there are some factors to take into consideration when deciding on the period of

your stay.

The hurricane season lasts from June to September, and that's when some of the local establishments choose to close, but those who decide to stay open usually offer lower rates, especially on accommodation. Be sure to check the forecasts, and it it's a good idea to have your schedule and tickets allow for some degree of flexibility, just in case.

The months going from December to April feature the highest prices and the largest amount of visitors, marking the start of the dry season.

April and May on the other hand have the lowest

amount of visitors with not particularly high chances of rainfall, if you want to pick a sweet spot between the high and low seasons.

Providenciales International Airport (PLS)



The Providenciales
International Airport
(PLS) is the only airport
on the island featuring
flights by international
companies, mainly

coming from North America but also from the United Kingdom, Canada, Cuba, Bahamas and Iamaica.

There will be immigration and customs landing cards to fill out after your landing, then you'll be able to rent a car or take a taxi to get to your accommodation location.

The airport also offers flights to the other islands in the archipelago.

There is no cruise port on Providenciales. Cruise ships enter Turks and Caicos via Grand Turk, and you will need to take a flight to reach Provo from there (no ferry service available as of late 2019).
