Today, Valladolid is a bustling university city that thrives on its manufacturing industries. It is a down-to-earth, lively place that blends the old with the energetic new.

The main shopping street of Valladolid is Calle de Santiago, which runs between Plaza Mayor and Plaza de Zorrilla. To the East of Calle de Santiago lies Calle Mantería which is a pedestrianized walkway featuring shoes, clothes, cakes and many other delightful things. The big brands tend to cluster on Paseo de Zorrilla, on the western flank of Campo Grande, and you can for example find the famous El Corte Inglés in this zone.

Valladolid Airport is located ten kilometres from the city centre, on the Valladolid-Léon road. There is a bus route that links the airport with the

centre of Valladolid and two routes to Madrid and Léon. The estimated travel time between

Valladolid bus station and the airport is 30 min and the service is operated by a company called Linecar. They go approximately every 90 min and from the airport the service operates between 8.30 to 20.45 on the weekdays and from 9.45 to 19.15 on Saturdays and from 11.15 to 20.45 on Sundays.


